## Addressing Emergent Diseases

Ms. Tully and Mrs. Story's service learning group, Community Health, had three speakers David, Ruthy, and Cindy, address 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, and 11<sup>th</sup> graders about the challenge of living with HIV/AIDS. HIV is a viral disease that attacks your immune system so that you cannot fight off disease. Once you are infected with HIV, it doesn't go away. AIDS occurs when a person's T-cell count goes below 200 as a result of the virus and they have two or more opportunistic infections. Each speaker had a different story about how they contracted HIV, and emphasized that HIV does not discriminate. HIV, however, is not easy to get. It is communicated by contact with blood or sexual contact. When diagnosed in the 1980's they were told that they would have 2-3 years to live. Now, antiviral drugs are available and they are on medication to lower the level of the virus in their bodies. All three speakers are doing well and have lived more than 20 years with the virus, despite health challenges from the side effect of medications. They gave a positive message of hope and faith, and stressed the importance of living each day with a purpose.
